Tonight's net is open to all licensed amateurs. Not licensed yet? Regularly scheduled testing sessions are held at convenient locations near you. Visit SSRA.NET for more information on obtaining your ham radio license. SSRA repeaters are in N.E. Oregon, and in S.E Washington, using negative off sets and a tone of 123.0 Hz. We welcome scanner listeners, and stations connecting with WIRES X, or ECHOLINK. We kindly ask that you not follow the station ahead of you too closely, or "quick key". Please allow at least 3 seconds of dead-air between any stations transmissions.

Urgent traffic will ALWAYS have priority on any amateur radio band.

This is your invitation to our net. Please check into our net by providing your FCC call sign and location to be checked in. Our net is a simple Rag-Chew, and is casual. We meet here at 7 PM Pacific **every night of the week**, until we have no more check-ins.

This net is DIRECTED, so please wait to check in until invited. First we ask for "In & Out" "stations, and mobiles. For stations wishing to be In & Out, we will acknowledge your call sign only and move onto our next station. After "In and Outs" and "Mobiles", we'll start the regular portion of the net with any and all station check-ins.
